NORTH AMERICAN PAIRS QUALIFYING SCHEDULE

The North American Pairs qualifying games will be held during June, July and August. There are three masterpoint flights: A, Open; B, 0-2000; C, 0-500 (Non-Life Master). You may qualify to play at any NAP qualifying game at any club in North America. Those that qualify can play in the District 3 Final (no Unit Final). The top three pairs in each flight will qualify to play in the North American Final to be played at the Spring 2007 Nationals in St. Louis, MO. Qualifiers in all flights will receive subsidies as follows:

- First Place: Airfare and the equivalent of 3 nights in the host hotel
\$100 per player from District 3
\$125 per player from Unit 188 (Unit members only)
- Second Place: Airfare from the ACBL
\$100 per player from District 3
\$125 per player from Unit 188 (Unit members only)
- Third Place: \$100 per player from District 3
\$125 per player from Unit 188 (Unit members only)

This N' That From Your District Director

The Spring NABC in Dallas was fairly well attended with 10,318 tables in play. Lower than the number from nine years ago, but nevertheless a respectable turnout. The volunteers did a great job with hospitality and the playing conditions were wonderful.

The Board meetings were uneventful. We had a demonstration of the new Bridgemate Wireless System. I had seen this in use in Estoril last fall during the World Championships and it is really fantastic. It is a 25 button keypad on a small box which is placed on each bridge table and uses radio waves. All of the players' names and ACBL numbers would be entered at each table and then the North player records the score and Bridgemate provides a direct verification of results. The results are sent to a server and it can score up to 127 tables per server. When there are more tables involved, then you simply use more computers. It has been FCC approved and has low battery consumption. The ACBL is considering purchasing them for use at NABCs, and I'm sure they will be available for purchase by units and districts and clubs. This will save considerably on the need for as many caddies and, for that matter, as many directors. I predict you will see these in use very soon.

Our President, Harriette Buckman, has opted to convent the Board's

Masterpoint Committee almost a year early. I was again appointed to this committee. Its purpose is to look at inconsistencies in our Masterpoint formula. Things to think about include: too few MPs for Stratified Open Pairs; too many MPs in Bracketed KOs and Compact KOs; the many inequities that have risen from the special games at clubs vs. unit-wide games; people becoming Life Master without ever having played against an "A" player; and I'm sure many other topics. If you have any problems that you would like to see addressed or, better yet, any solutions, please e-mail me at joanandromn@att.net. I can't promise to make it better, but we can try.

I would be remiss not to mention that the ACBL finished this past year over budget by about \$347,000. This was clearly upsetting since the Board was not made aware of this at our fall meetings and did not know until the end of the year. The marketing department went over by \$100,000; the Legal, Audit and Consulting fees were over by \$90,000; and sanction fees were budgeted too optimistically. We had budgeted to lose about the same amount so the loss turned into \$693,000.

Jay Baum, our CEO, is implementing a new forecasting model and new financial guidelines. This loss, by the way, is only 2.5% over

budget. The Finance Committee will be monitoring this very closely. The good news is that the ACBL still remains well within our financial guidelines and we have surely made our displeasure known to management.

District 3's bridge activities for the summer should be a lot of fun. The Saratoga Springs Regional, June 12-18, is at the newly renamed hotel - The Saratoga (formerly the Prime Hotel & Conference Center). With all renovated sleeping rooms most of the playing area redone, it should be a pleasant place to win lots of gold points. This year we have added a second Compact KO, along with three bracketed KOs - tons of opportunities to win gold points. And don't miss our brand new July 4th Regional in Parsippany, NJ at the Crowne Plaza. Many of you remember this hotel from when it was called the Sheraton Tara, and we were there in the summer. We'll be back there over the holiday, June 28-July 4. A great way to spend your July 4th weekend. And if you don't want to play every session of bridge you can lounge at the outdoor swimming pool. Make your plans now to spend the 4th with us.

Bridge is still the best form of entertainment. I look forward to seeing you this summer.

Suggested Bidding:
South West North East
1NT Pass Pass Pass

Suggested Lead:
♦Q: Top of a three-card or longer
sequence.

Suggested Play:
South should win and lead spades
from the South hand to drive out the
♠A and ♠Q. It is not necessary (and
may even lead to defeat) to use
dummy's ♥A for a spade finesse.
Declarer can establish the two
additional tricks needed to make the
contract by promoting the spades in the
South hand.

Tips: Plan the play
Count your tricks.

Defending against a strong 1♣

Most partnerships these days use 2♣ as a strong, artificial and forcing opening. Virtually every player learning the game learns this as one of their first conventions. But many experienced partnerships play Precision or other systems where 1♣ is the strong and artificial opening, and 2♣ has another meaning (such as a limited opening bid with a real club suit). Unfamiliarity with how to defend against a strong 1♣ opening often causes newer players not to compete in these auctions, leading to poor results.

The basic theory is that it is safer to overcall strong 1♣ hands with good distribution, like conventional overcalls of 1NT openings such as Cappelletti or DONT. This article will discuss two conventional approaches to overcalling a strong 1♣ opener. Other defenses also exist. Regardless of what defense you use, you and your partner must agree on minimum point counts, suit quality, and minimum distributions to make this type of overcall.

Defense to Big Club (DBC)

DBC is designed to let you immediately distinguish in one bid between one-suited (typically a six-card suit) and two-suited (typically 5-5 or more) overcalls.

1♦, 1♥, 1♠ and 3♣ all show single-suited hands. You simply bid your suit. These bids do not need to be alerted. Some people modify this by using a double of 1♣ (instead of bidding 3♣) to show a single-suited hand in clubs, but this needs to be alerted.

Every combination of two-suited hands can be shown by an overcall between 1NT and 2NT. All of these bids must be alerted.

1NT = ♦ and ♠
2♣ = ♣ and ♦
2♦ = ♦ and ♥
2♥ = ♥ and ♠
2♠ = ♠ and ♣
2NT = ♣ and ♥

Partner is expected to pass or correct a suit bid, or pick one of the two suits named by a NT overcall.

Suction

Suction also permits you to show both one- and two- suited overcalls, but is more complicate because bids have multiple meanings. The overcall structure is as follows, and every bid must be alerted:

Double = ♣ and ♥
1♦ = ♥; OR ♠ and ♣
1♥ = ♠; OR ♣ and ♦
1♠ = ♣; OR ♦ and ♥
1NT = ♦ and ♠
2♣ = ♦; OR ♥ and ♠

Double and 1NT simply ask partner to pick one of the two suits shown. But every suit bid is a relay to the next higher suit (and the relay must also be alerted). If overcaller has a one-suited hand, overcaller passes the relay. Otherwise the overcaller continues with the next higher suit to show the appropriate two-suiter. For example, if overcaller bids 1♥, his partner must bid 1♠. The overcaller will pass 1♠ with spades, or bid 2♣ to show ♣ and ♦ and ask partner to choose.

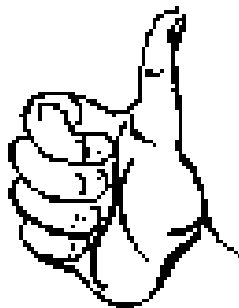
