Editor's Corner



Having the NABC right here in New York made it so convenient to attend. I saw many of you playing there during the week. It was a blast! If you missed it, you missed a lot.

I played in the National IMP Pairs event during the NABC. I think playing in a national event against the best is something that every player should do at least once.

While playing in the qualifying two sessions of the IMP Pairs, the director got called to my table four times. But these were not run-of-the-mill director calls. There was an interesting story behind every one of them.

Right from the start, the director was at our table for the first board. Sitting North, I was the dealer. I put the stop card intending to open with a weak 2♥. But before I could get the 2♥ bid on the table, East proceeded to bid 1♠! The director had to go to the rule book on this one: the 1♠ could not be accepted, I must make my bid as planned, and there were further auction penalties for East-West depending on if East just made his bid sufficient.

Later in the session, I chose to open 1♥ rather than a strong 2♣ with a 1-5-2-5 pattern and 21 HCP. Our agreement was not to open 2♣ with a 2-suited hand, and I figured someone was going to bid spades, and I wouldn't be passed in 1♥. Wrong! 1♥ made

6. We had time at the end of the round, and I wanted to look at my partner's hand to see if we might have gotten to 6♥ if I'd opened 2♣. But the board had already been passed, and I saw my partner's hand for the next round! We were required to play the board so I held the hand I had seen, and our opponents had options on which way they sat.

On to the evening session. One of our opponents had a card mis-turned (nobody said anything at the time), and at the end of the hand we reviewed the tricks to show her she had a trick turned wrong. Our opponents knew two of the directors for the event (including the Director in Charge), and they called them over for an advisory opinion as to who can say what, and when, if this happens. Despite what the August 2004 *Bridge Bulletin* says, the laws are not clear cut on this any more. Different directors will give different rulings. (The two national tournament directors we spoke to then, and a third director I spoke to later, all had different opinions.)

Finally the last round.. When we arrive, the table where the boards are coming from isn't even done with the first (of two) boards. We are told to play the second board first, and the slow players would then play the board after we were done with it. No late play.

Some strange stuff.

Bob Goldwater Retiring From WCBA Board

Bob Goldwater will be retiring from the WCBA Board of Directors effective October 31, 2004. Bob has been on the Board for 38 years. Bob is the only person to have contributed to the Unit in five capacities - Board member, certified director, certified teacher, player (Gold Life Master), and journalist.

For his long tenure, Bob has set or come close to setting some longevity records with the Board. He has served under 21 of the 31 past presidents of the Unit, including himself. He is the third oldest person to have served on the Board.

Bob got the Westchester County Department of Parks and Recreation involved in bridge. Through his efforts, they still annually sponsor the Golden Apple Swiss Teams at the Closed

Westchester Tournament. Additionally, he got the Leitman Memorial bowls donated for the winner of the Saturday afternoon game at the Closed Westchester.

He chaired the Master/Non-Master game for 13 years, and is the only person to have played in all 27 years to date. Bob also edited the Membership Directory three times. He served 6 years on the ACBL Board of Governors, an advisory group to the ACBL Board of Directors.

In addition to everything else he has done, Bob has been a mainstay for *Bridging the Counties* for many years. He has been the Associate Editor and Staff Photographer for many years. (No pictures this issue.)

Bob also used to write the Sunday bridge column for 24 years for the Gannett Westchester

newspaper, until they stopped running it.

Bob is not retiring from bridge. He says he will occasionally sit in on future Board meetings. He also plans to keep directing and playing in games and tournaments.



This N' That From Your District Director

After 30 long years, New York has hosted another NABC. The NABC returned to New York with much fanfare, and attendance that was 15% over management's predictions. Unit 188 had 479 players who attended, which is close to 1/3 of our Unit. We were just behind the Unit from central New Jersey, but they have about 1,000 more members than we do so the percentages were about the same. The NABC had a table count of 13,351, a number we can be proud of.

Hats off to some of our organizers: our two tournament chairmen, Bill Rosenbaum and Jerry Goodman; Pairing Chairman Jon Green; and our Unit's Steven Surasky, the Finance Officer. Steve held this same position at the 1991 NABC in Atlantic City, which was also co-hosted by District 3.

Thanks to Mimi Bieber for organizing a whole group of volunteers from our Unit who were super in helping in all of the key areas. Tired, but proud of New York City and our volunteers, we hope that the circus will return much sooner than 30 years. Thank you for your participation and volunteer efforts.

On to the ACBL Board meetings. Budget assumptions for 2005 have no increase in club, sectional or regional sanction fees, no increase in NABC entry fees, a 7% increase in director fees to the tournament sponsors (3% for salary, 4% for other expenses), and a \$3 increase in membership dues. I voted against this because I wanted to wait for the final analysis in the fall, and felt that losing 3-4 months of dues increases would not be a problem. A modest 10%

increase over a four year period is something we can all understand.

Jay Baum reported an upward trend in membership for the first 6 months of 2004. Across the ACBL regional table counts are up slightly, while sectional table counts are slightly down.

Two new categories of Life Master were created: emerald for 7,500 MPs, and platinum for those who reach 10,000 MPs but have not won a national championship.

We have a new location for our fall regional from October 18-24, right in our back yard—the Sheraton Danbury in Danbury, CT. Thanks to District 25. Great playing conditions, a great schedule and low room rates. Don't miss it!

Jane Hill Sectional

On November 12-13, newcomers to duplicate bridge will have the opportunity to play in a sectional just for them at the Jane Hill Future Masters Sectional. This tournament is held annually in honor of the late Jane Hill, who was renowned for her ability to teach bridge to beginning players. On both days, the games will be held at the Memorial United Methodist Church, 250 Bryant Avenue, White Plains.

Players with fewer than 100 masterpoints are eligible to participate. Silver points will be awarded.

NAP Finals Scheduled

For the first time, there will be no Unit final for the North American Pairs. Next on the schedule for the NAPs will be the District level finals. The Club rounds, which occurred over the summer, allowed areas players to earn a qualification to play at the District final. Only players who have already earned their qualification this year can play in the District final.
