In spite of the disappointment, Rosanna and I spent another week at the Nationals and participated in several other events; some side pairs games, fast pairs, and several bracketed knock-out events and a Board - A-Match game using the partnership desk to hook up with teammates. All in all, while not doing exceptionally well we did do well enough to earn some red and gold points and certainly enjoyed the experience.

By the time you read this, I hope that many of you will have participated in our Unit's August Sectional Tournament at the County Center. Winners from the various events can be found on page 4. Beginning this year this annual summer sectional will

be called the WCBA Peter Kalat Summer Sectional to recognize and honor the memory of our former colleague, Peter Kalat, for his many contributions to our extended bridge community, including as a mentor to new players, a Unit 188 director and previous President, and President of District 3. His widow, Nie Lih, has arranged for trophies to be presented to the players winning the most master points and participating in at least 2 different events during the tournament in both the open and limited games.

The Unit Board is getting ready to prepare another Membership Directory since it's been over 3 years since the last one was issued. ## Editor's Corner



In my last column, I discussed some poor behavior at the bridge table. I am going to start off this column by writing about some good behavior at the table.

At a recent club game, I was playing against Bill Hessberg and Lori Sullivan. After wrapping up a redoubled contract, my partner made a gloating comment which was intended as humorous, but which could easily have been taken as obnoxious and insulting. Rather than respond in a negative way, they defused the situation with humor. Now I am not advocating ignoring misbehavior at the table. My point is that you need to respond in an appropriate way, and not respond with bad behavior of your own.

At another club game, I was playing against two people who I don't know. LHO was clearly an inexperienced player. Towards the end of one of the auctions, I made a bid, and my LHO passed after a long hesitation. Partner passed, and my RHO passed. RHO later told his partner that after the hesitation he was barred from doubling unless it was a clear-cut action. It was a good lesson in ethical behavior for the

newer player. We can only hope that more people would behave this way.

At another club game, I was put in the ethical hot seat. I opened 1♥. LHO, without using the stop card, bid 2♠ as a weak jump overcall. My partner pulled the stop card, but bids only 3♥. There was no director call, as my RHO was the director of the game! I received a brief lecture on my ethical obligations, and the director passed. Now I had to go into the tank. My partner had made a competitive bid - some values, but perhaps not a full limit raise. But I had unauthorized information that I couldn't use that he really had a weak hand. I had a strong hand (I would bid 4♥ over a limit raise, and would invite game over a simple raise). A real competitive raise left me with choices. I had to consider what would I have chosen over a competitive raise, without the unauthorized information. After I hesitated for about a minute, I decided it probably would have been normal to bid 4♥, so I bid it and went down one trick. But the director commended me for my ethics.

Let's all play bridge the way we should.

## This N' That From Your District Director

It has been a great summer for bridge. District 3's Holiday Regional held in Fairfield, NJ was a big success. Players loved the new location – about 10 minutes closer for our Westchester players than Parsippany. Good playing conditions, a great schedule and best of all a big July 4<sup>th</sup> buffet dinner with chicken, hot dogs and all the trimmings. If you weren't there you missed a wonderful tournament.

The Las Vegas NABC was, as expected, huge! There were 19, 720 tables in play – which makes it the 4<sup>th</sup> largest NABC, behind only 2 previous Las Vegas ones and a Toronto one which were a bit bigger. Several important decisions were made at the Board meetings. The Board voted to keep Memphis as the Headquarters. Other cities were considered but it seemed prudent for the time being to stay put. The current method of hearing Appeals cases for NABC+ events was reaffirmed. Players will continue to appeal a director's ruling to a committee of their peers rather than to a panel of tournament directors. And – effective in January 2010

achieving the rank of Life Master will require 500 master points. 100 will have to be Gold/Platinum; 100 Red/Gold, and 75 Silver; 75 Black. None of us need to be concerned. If you are currently a member of the ACBL or join or rejoin between now and 1/1/10 you will continue to need only 300 master points.. It's after that it will change. I think everyone would agree that with the many ways to earn large numbers of points and pigmented points that this will be a good thing.

September 27<sup>th</sup> is the District Finals for the North American Pairs at the Guardian Angel Auditorium in Allendale, NJ. Schenectady, NY will also be holding sections of Flights B & C. Flight A is only in Allendale. If you qualified at a club you are eligible to play as long as you and your partner are residents of District 3. Check out the regulations in this issue of Bridging the Counties and on District 3's web site. [www.bridge-district3.org](http://www.bridge-district3.org).

And to wind up the year, District 3 offers the Fall Foliage Regional in Danbury, CT, during October 13-19. There will be special room rates and

great hospitality. And almost no gas is needed to get there and back. There is a schedule chock full of KOs, Compact KOs; Swiss Teams, Newplicate games and - yes- our Senior and Open Pair games. Something for everyone. The full schedule is in this issue of *Bridging the Counties* on page 12, and also on our District 3's web site.

There is nothing more fun and challenging than a bridge game. Winning is good but even when you don't it's still OK. See you at the tables.

### In Memoriam Richard G. Hewitt (1927-2008)

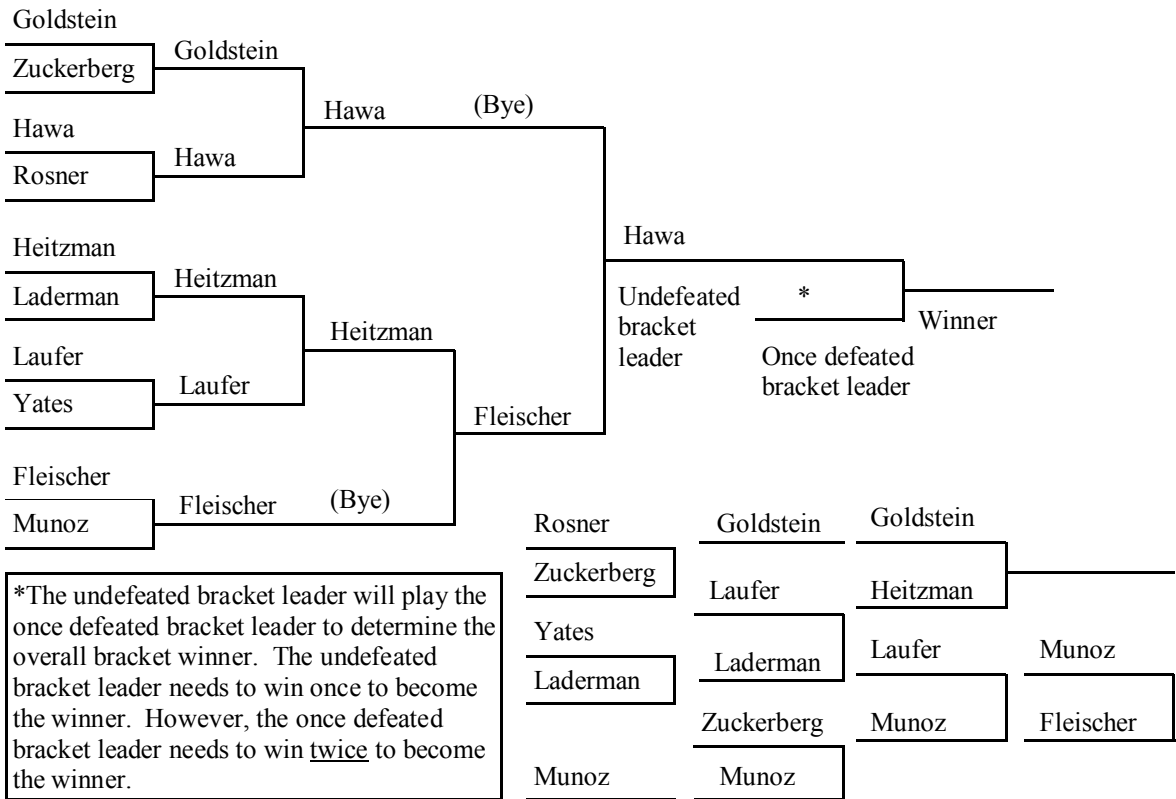
Dick was one of the founding members of Unit 188, Westchester County. After serving as Unit President, Dick went on to become President of District 3. In 1975, Dick was elected as District Director to the ACBL Board. In 1981, Dick organized and ran the Bermuda Bowl at the Hilton Rye Town.

Although he moved to New York City close to 20 years ago, he retained his memberships in Unit 188 and District 3 where he played such a huge role.

Dick won innumerable regional tournaments. He had been close to becoming a Diamond Life Master.

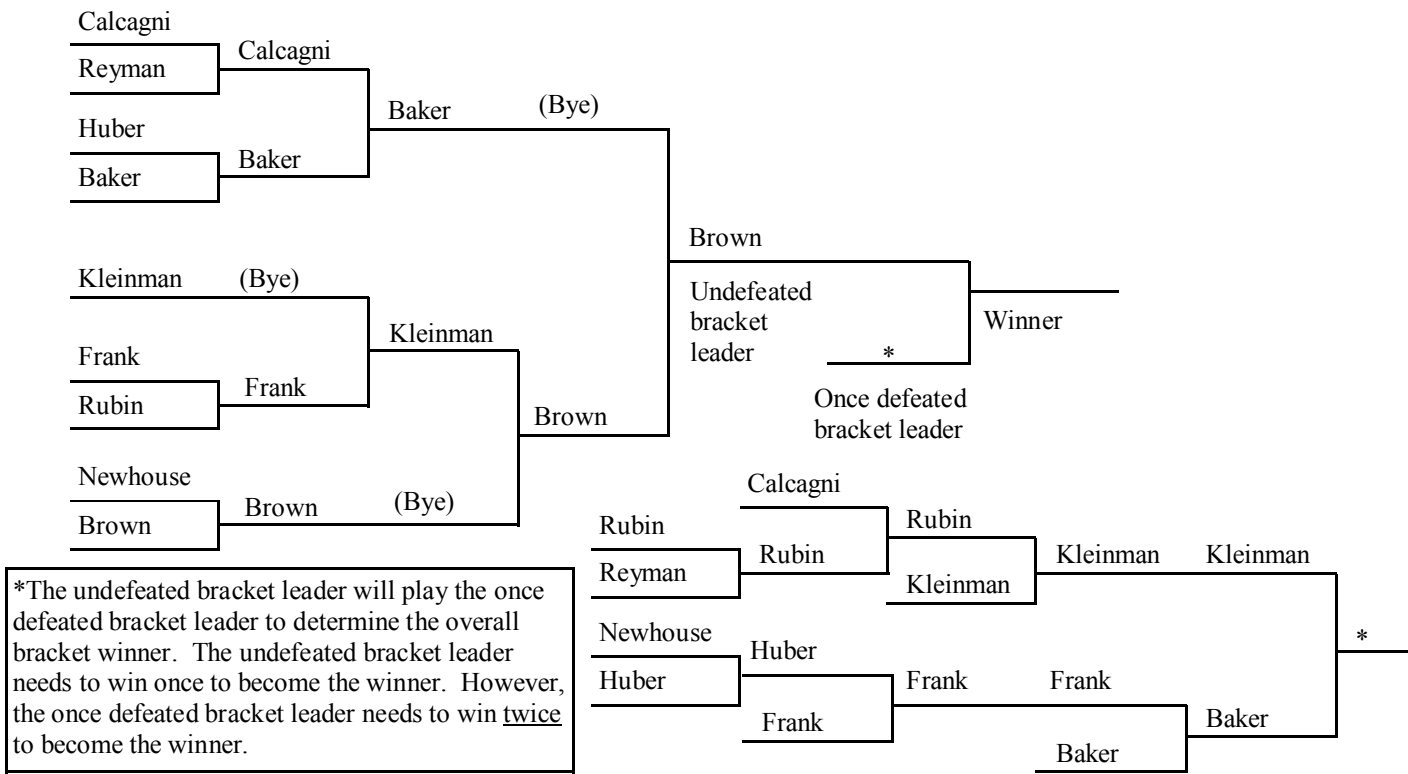
Dick is survived by his wife Genevieve, brother Don, four children and step-children, and five grandchildren. His first wife, Shirley, died in 1986.

# 2008 Westchester Double Knockout Bracket 1



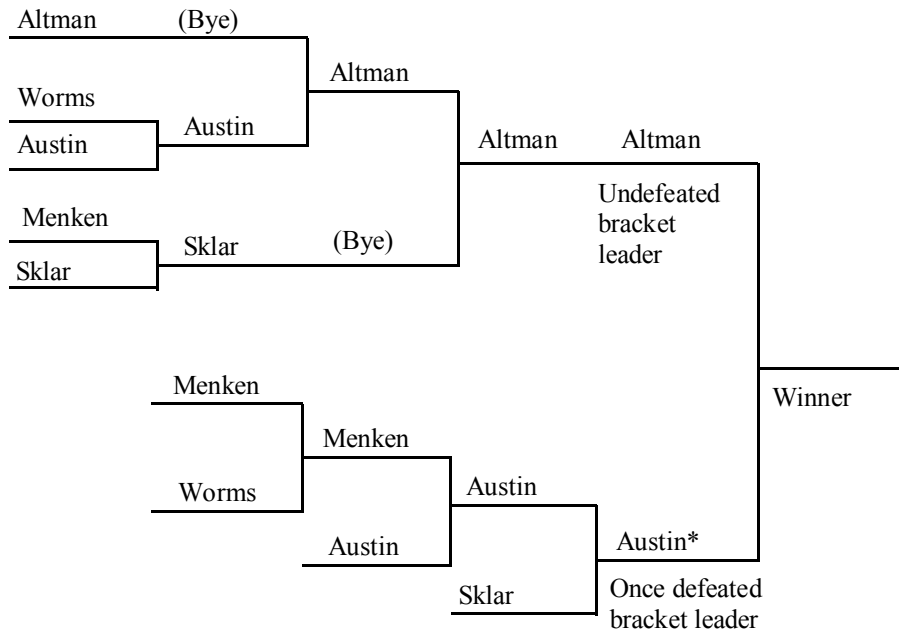

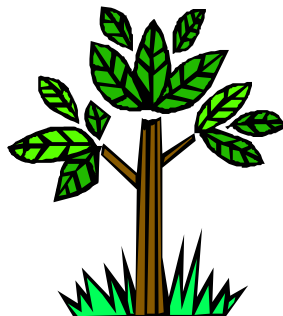

## Roy Hill Master / Non-Master Game

The 32nd annual Roy Hill Master / Non-Master game will be held at the Bridge Deck in the evening of Sunday, December 7.

For this special game, players with fewer than 50 masterpoints are randomly paired with Life Masters. This is a very social event, as well as giving the non-masters a good learning experience.
